Harrop Farm to Become Industry, Office Complex

The century-old Harrop farm on the Base Line has been sold to a Toronto development company which plans to build an industrial plaza, motel and office complex on the 96 acre site. The Edwin Harrop farm was

sold to Alliance Building Corporation, a leading industrial developer in Ontario, for an undisclosed sum.

Construction of the first mul tiple industrial buildings will begin as soon as work on a sewer line to the property is completed. Alliance vice president David Satok said.

The larger buildings in the complex will come a little later, he said, adding he could not estimate when the development would be completed.

The complex includes a motel and restaurant which will be built on Highway 25 on the west An office building will be built near the Halton County building. Satok said.




