

# Cable TV Comes to Glen Williams Norval Will Be Next On The List

A. J. Jamieson, president of Georgetown Cable TV Ltd., announced this week that the company has commenced construction of cable services in Glen Williams.

Work was delayed until the government's Canadian Radio-Television Commission confirmed the company's application to cover the Georgetown area, including Glen Williams and Norval.

Originally, all CATV operations in Canada were licensed by the Department of Transport, but with the formation of the CRTC early in 1968, all existing licenses were cancelled, until new applicants could be assessed.

At that time, Georgetown Cable TV had planned to extend service to the Glen and Norval areas but could not proceed until they were advised, as a result of their hearing before the commission in March of this year, one

that they could continue their expansion program.

It was announced late in July that a new license had been granted, and boundaries of the area of coverage were detailed at that time.

Since plans for Glen Williams were virtually complete, the officers of the local cable company decided to proceed immediately, and upon completion, work in Norval will follow without delay.

Mr. Jamieson also confirmed plans to begin televising programs on Channel 5. These would be filmed or video-taped locally, and composed of fare pertaining to the community. Early fall is the expected time of commencement, and the company is now in the process of purchasing cameras, video-tape recorders and other equipment necessary to the production of programs.

# Combined Health Units is Goal as Halton Seeks MOH

Halton County council may ask Health Minister Dr. Matthew Dymond to help Halton attract a new medical officer by combining Peel and Halton county health units, Garfield Brown, county administrator said last week.

The county personnel committee will make the recommendation to council August 26.

A new medical officer of health could then be assured of being "top man" in both counties, said Brown.

"Peel probably won't be happy with this resolution but we think combining the two units would have a settling effect."

However, Peel County Wardens Mrs. Nance Horwood said last week that amalgamation of health units will receive top consideration when the county health board meets next Wednesday. Council meets on August 21.

Last month county council rejected a special committee's report opposing amalgamation.

Brown said the uncertainties of proposed regional government and the prospect of a Peel-Halton merger were discouraging applicants for the health job.

Halton is trying to find a replacement for Dr. L. M. Stuart who retires August 31. Dr. Stuart has been Halton MOH for the past two years.

The county has advertised for a new MOH for about a

month and has received seven inquiries.

Only three of the doctors were properly qualified and held public certificates of health said Brown.

"And there is only one applicant we'd pay more than \$17,000," he added.

"Actually, \$17,000 a year is a starting salary and we are prepared to go a great deal above that... perhaps as high as \$30,000 for the right man."

**5 Year Old Boy Wins With Pet Calf**

Five year old Tim Kunica of Hornby went to a Jersey cattle show in Galt with his pet calf Ness.

He came home last week with the Ontario junior champion.

Tim's calf won the provincial title over 81 other calves.

Ness also won first place in a class of 55 other calves giving Tim two ribbons and two trophies to take back home.

About 250 calves competed in the Ontario Junior Jersey rally. Tim is the son of Dr. and Mrs. Richard Kunica of Falgarbrook Farm near Hornby.

The Kunicas are still recovering from a tragic fire at their farm in April which destroyed the barn and 50 head of cattle, resulting in considerable financial loss.

They currently have 70 head of cattle on the farm.

Tim is currently re-grooming his champion calf Ness for an annual Milton fair next month.

# Was Staff Member of Armenian Boy's School

A Georgetown resident for several years, Miss Jane Anne Farmer, 88, died at Woodstock on August 6.

Miss Farmer, who made her home here for some years with her sister, Mrs. Margaret Smythe and continued to live in their Main St. N. home following Mrs. Smythe's death some years ago, had been a practical nurse in Toronto and was employed at the school for Armenian boy orphans when it was operating here.

She was born at Blossomfort, Ballyclough, County Cork, Ireland, later lived in Dublin and came to Canada in the early twenties.

As a member of St. George's Anglican Church, she had been a member of women's groups there and had belonged to the hospital auxiliary and the horticultural society.

She was predeceased by her sister, Mrs. Smythe and by two brothers, Robert and Richard who designed and built Dublin's Abbey Theatre. Her closest relative in America is a cousin, Mrs. John Barrer, who with her husband flew from their home in Los Angeles, Cal. to attend the funeral.

Rev. Eric Mills conducted the service at the Harold C. McClure Funeral Home on Friday and interment was in Greenwood Cemetery.
