### Claims Summer Courses Not Publicized Among Students

The question of whether sufficient advertising was done for Halton County summer school this year was raised last week.

Trustee Liberty Pease, said according to his daughters there was little advertising carried out in schools to inform students of courses available at summer school until too late.

"What I'd like to know is how many courses were not offered for lack of registration?" he asked O. A. Gilmore, superintendent of instruction for the Halton County Board of Education.

Gilmore replied that with the exception of Latin, all courses Grades 9 through 12 were offered — English, history, geography, French, Science and mathematics.

Music Offered

Music was offered in enrichment classes and grade 13 students — about 40 of them — were deployed to Hamilton summer school because of insufficient registrants.

He said insufficient advertising of specific courses may have been true because the board had difficulty getting information from the Dept. of Education about whether summer school instruction and transportation costs were eligible for provincial subsidy.

"The advertising of the existence of summer school itself, however, was definitely done well in advance," said Gilmore. "Newspapers carried reports of the board's approval
