Young Cyclist Dies After Acton Crash

An Acton youth was killed and his friend seriously injured in a motorcycle - car collision in Acton, Friday evening.

Dead is 18-year-old Leonard Varey of 290 Arthur Street. In Guelph General Hospital with multiple injuries is Daniel Bruce Harkley, also of Acton.




