Fears that a merger between Halton and Peel county health units would force Halton - Peel regional government, are unfounded, says Halton East MP, James Snow.

"The proposed health unit merger has nothing at all to do with regional government Snow said in an interview.

The statement came after Halton County Council last month turned down the proposal as an attempt to "blackmail" the county into regional government with Peel.

County council has been fighting the implementation of a Halton - Peel super region since it was introduced by Municipal Affairs Minister Darcy McKeough in January. It supports a separate Halton region.

"County health unit mergers have been recommended all over Ontario in many areas where regional government is not even considered," he said.

Noting that provincial grants to the new unit would increase to 75 per cent from the 50 per cent grant Halton now gets, Snow emphasized the tax burden, easing benefits of the plan.

He also pointed out the efficiency of having only one Medical Officer of Health to serve the two counties.

CLERGY COMMENT

Bridge Building

"The Bridge Builder" is a little news sheet published by the United Church Board of Men. I like that name. If we are bridgebuilders then our purpose is to bring together or reconcile separated individuals or groups within our society.

In 1955 the CANSO Causeway, which links Cape Breton with the mainland was completed, in spite of the prediction of the oldtimers in the area who said it could never be done. It was indeed a remarkable achievement, overcoming high tides, the deep water, the ice flows, etc., but with hard work, engineering skill and money the task was completed, and the Cape Bretoners were able to say that the rest of Canada was now privileged to be joined to their island. It is true, of course, that Cape Breton does have much to give the "rest" of Canada, just as they have much to gain. The bridging of the gap (Strait of Canso) helped to bring the separated people together.

I would like to think that our aim as Church members, as concerned people, is to be bridgebuilders. Churches often liken themselves to a lighthouse, which sends forth its light into dark places. I like bridgebuilder better. We are NOT people who have all the truth. We ARE people who can share, and help others to share the knowledge, the truth, the love given to us by God.

The theme of the mission study of our United Church this year is "Reconciliation in a Broken World." Reconciliation is our Church's business. If we are not so involved it is difficult to call ourselves Christians. The poor, the sick, the prisoner, the members of minority groups and others who are alienated from our society need our support that they may more freely return to, or in such cases become part of, for the first time, healthy society.

I am concerned about the prisoner who is often given a helpful and worthwhile training while in prison, but little or no support when released.

The St. Leonard's (half-way) House (Peel) is one agency in this area attempting to overcome this barrier. It is a bridge between the world you and I know and the strange, often hostile world, which faces a man newly-released from prison. I hope that local St. Leonard House societies will be established in this and other areas to support the work financially as well as other ways. The recidivism (return to prison) rate in Canada is about 76 per cent — an alarming statistic, yet we pass by on the other side.

I am also concerned about the mental health of people with nervous or emotional difficulties and who attempt to face these problems alone. A Handshake Club, an Organization to help those who want help meets each Tuesday evening at Grace United Church, Brampton (completely free from church affiliation — the church provides the room only) This is an opportunity for the 15 or 20 people in the Club to talk over their difficulties and have some fun and fellowship together. This is another attempt to be a "bridge" in our society. I expect a similar handshake club will soon be organized in Georgetown.

Albert Schweitzer said "Look and see if there is not some place where you may invest your humanity." Bridge-building is a worthy occupation.
