In Holy Cross Roman Catholic Church on July 12th, Father Martin officiated at the marriage of Patricia Ann Tost, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Franklin Tost, 32 Churchill Cres., when she became the bride of Mr. Frederick James Yates, son of Mr. and Mrs. James Yates, 50 Henry Street.

The church was decorated with standards of white poms accented with a touch of turquoise. Kenneth R. Harrison, the organist, accompanied Mrs. Harry Greig with three selections during the ceremony: "The Wedding Prayer," "The Lord's Prayer," and "O Perfect Love." Mr. Tost gave his daughter in marriage in the double ring ceremony.

The bride wore a gown of shimmering ligoda with gentle shaping to the front and a sweeping train gathered to the natural waistline at the back. Turquoise colour touched the gown with blue satin ribbons twining through a garland of Venice lace daisies, drifting from the daisy trimmed neckline to the floor.

A stag was held by Mr. D. Jarvie and Mr. G. Perkins. They are making their home at 21 Raylawn Crescent, Georgetown.

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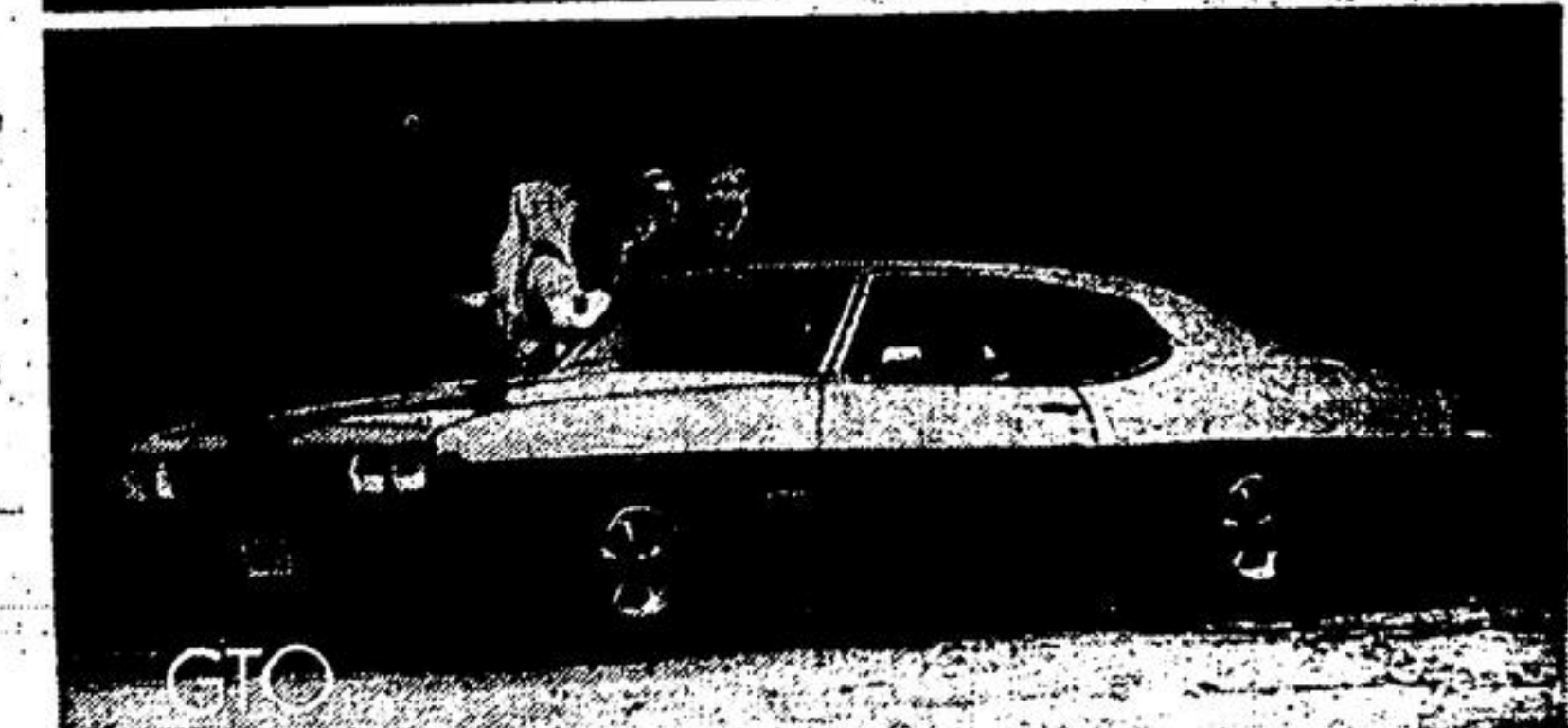


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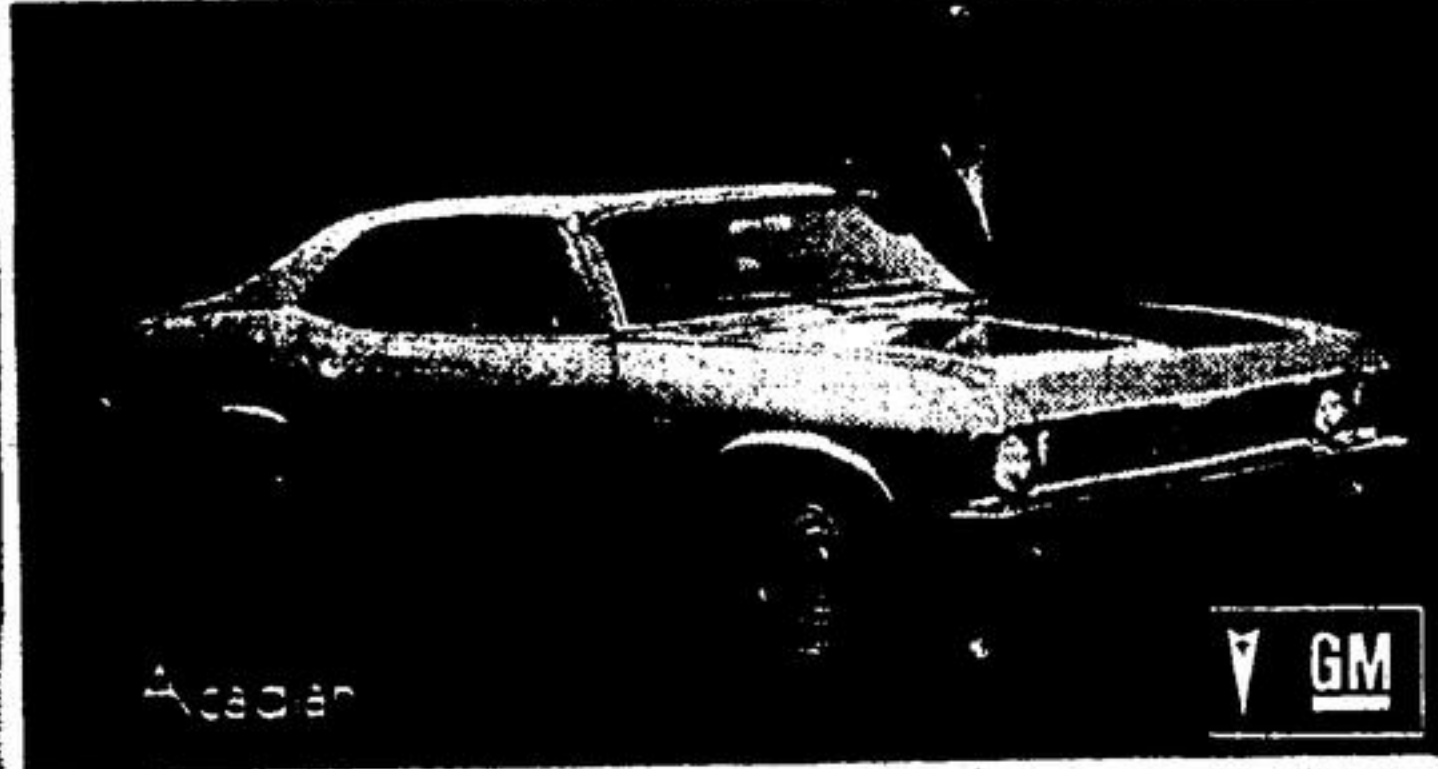


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
