

# Open Mind on Separate Halton, Says McKeough

Municipal Affairs Minister Harry McKeough told a committee of Halton county reeves at a private meeting in his Toronto office last week that although he favours a metro-type Halton-Peel regional government he still has an open mind on a separate Halton region.

The committee was filled in on two possible regional government plans for Halton and Peel counties, the first combining them and the second keeping them separate.

In both cases Burlington was included in plans but in neither case was Orangeville, the Dufferin county seat north of Halton, included.

## Orangeville Area

It had been expected a possible regional government would be considered including Orangeville in the Halton and Peel set up.

"At the present time you can safely say Orangeville is not being considered as part of the Halton Peel plan," Jim Snow, Halton MPP told the press. He said the feeling is that Orangeville should not be segregated from Dufferin County.

Snow attended the Bay Street meeting with the reeves and mayors of the seven municipalities in Halton.

## Key Factor

The meeting was told Burlington is a key factor in the regional government plan and McKeough is waiting the outcome of the Steele Commission report due at the end of October.

The commission held several meetings earlier this year and heard submissions from municipalities involved in the regional overhaul to determine if Burlington should join the Halton Peel region or become part of a region with Hamilton and West-  
North County to the west.

## Two Counties

Figures presented at the meeting showed a slight financial benefit to Halton County if the two counties merge, Snow noted in his account.

Halton would benefit slightly more than Peel, he added.

A municipal affairs depart-

ment financial study showed regional government can be introduced in Halton-Peel at a saving to local taxpayers. It would cost less to operate a metro-type regional system in Halton-Peel than to maintain the existing municipal system of local government.

## Snow's Brief

Snow submitted recommendations to McKeough a year ago for boundaries based on a separate Halton region but he said he is "now not committed to either plan."

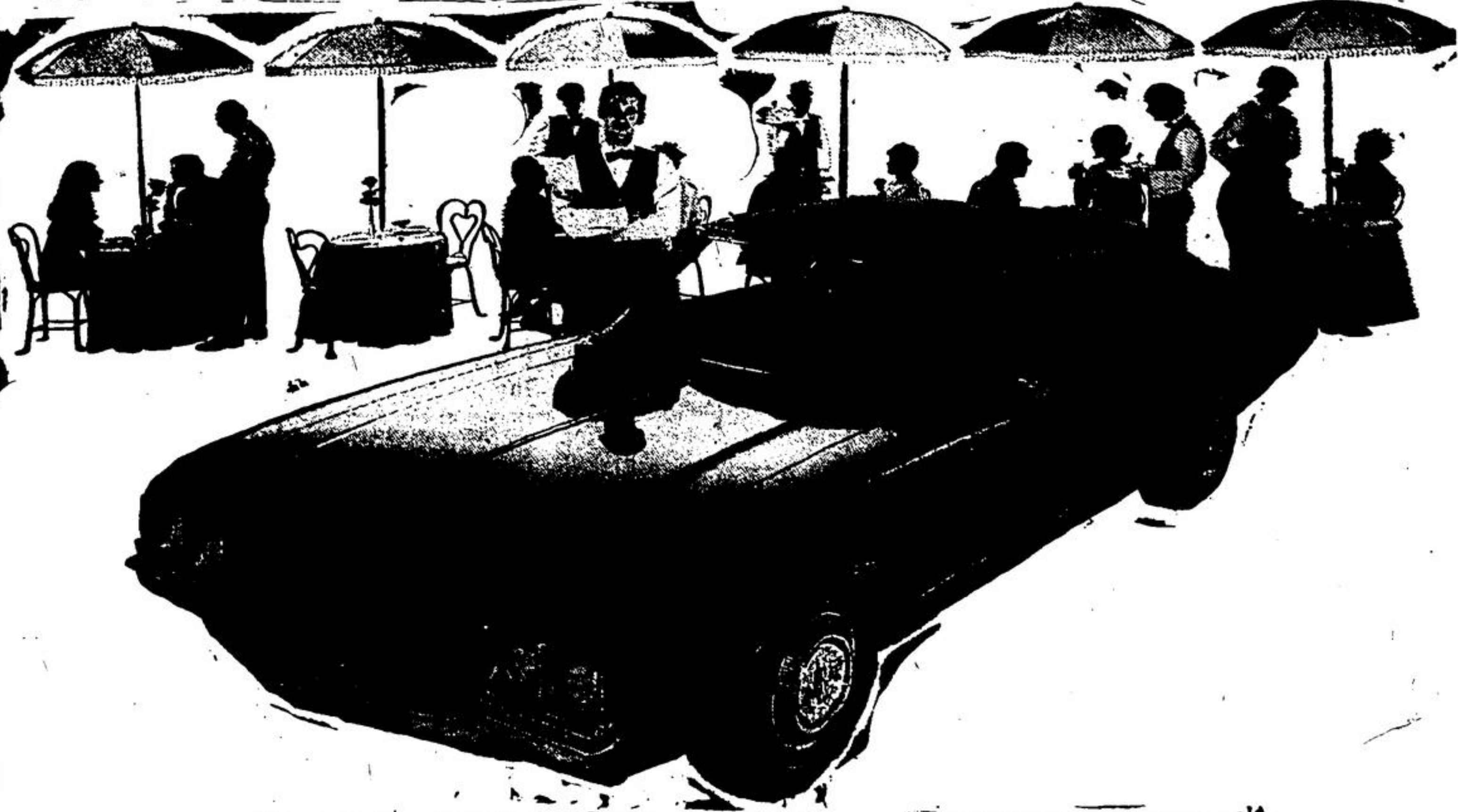
