SHARED RESPONSIBILITY

More and more people are turning to apartment living in response to scarce and expensive housing in those areas embracing Canada's larger urban centres. Many apartments are of the 'high rise' type.

Official figures show a 100 per cent increase in the number of apartment units built since 1966. Some of these rise to great heights, far beyond the reach of the tallest fire ladders.

With this increase comes more 'shared responsibility' in protection against fire. All governments share the responsibility for the well-being of apartment occupants by demanding safety features in construction, providing alarms and exits.

The occupant's share of responsibility is in knowing the alarm and escape plan and by practising fire prevention in his own home which is also the home of others.

Know how to smother a kitchen grease fire with a lid rather than water. Remember that smoking in bed is a foolhardy practice.

These are some of the reminders for Fire Prevention in Canada in 1969, for protection of the householder and his neighbours.
