

John Wardlaw, Janet Stevens West Flamboro Wedding Ceremony

The marriage of Miss Janet Ellen Stevens and Mr. John Thomas Wardlaw was solemnized September 20th at West Flamboro Presbyterian Church. The double ring ceremony was performed by Rev. J. F. Schissler. A large arrangement of white chrysanthemums and a pair of black wrought iron candelabra each holding seven lighted white tapers decorated the altar. Few bows and ribbons marked the guests' seats.

Mrs. Bertram Patterson played the wedding music and accompanied Mrs. Ruth Heatherington who sang "The Wedding Prayer" and "O Perfect Love".

The bride was given in marriage by Mr. George T. Stevens, her uncle. She was attired in a white satin, full length, semi-line gown with empire waistline and neckline. An attached full length cape of Chantilly lace extended to lily point, buttoned sleeves. A panel of satin gathered at the top fell to form a billowing floor length train of satin & lace. A white satin rose with two leaves extending towards the forehead. The only jewellery worn by the bride was a cultured pearl pendant. She carried a cascade of red roses and white stephanotis with white satin ribbons entwined.

Mrs. Lillian Stevens, Hamilton, was matron of honour for her sister in law.
