PLAN MOTOR INN ON GUELPH STREET

A 22 unit motel will be added to Georgetown's facilities next year if plans of Aler Investments materialize.

The firm, which has built several apartments in Georgetown, plans to build on the Tracey property on the north-east side of No. 7 Highway, near the town's eastern limits. Also in the plan would be two apartments on the valley be-

hind, with a total of 158 suites. The motor inn would contain a dining room, lounge and meeting room, as well as swimming pool.

An Aler spokesman told The Herald this week that his firm feels this would serve a definite need in Georgetown, where accommodation for travellers and those coming to town on business is almost non-existent.

The proposal, presented on Monday to council, was relayed to the planning board for consideration. A zoning change is involved before plans can proceed.

Will Study Recreation Plan in Committee

Recommending major changes in Georgetown's recreation set-up, Allan Drake, chairman of Cedarvale community centre board addressed council on Monday.

Mr. Drake detailed results of a meeting last week attended by representatives of public and private groups engaged in recreation work.

Their recommendation to council includes combining the board of parks, which operates the arena, the community centre board, which administers the swimming pool, and the Cedarvale board into one group of five appointees and two councillors.

Engaging a full time recreation director is a vital part of the proposed organization.

And they further suggest an annual public recreation conference.

Councillors did not discuss the proposals on Monday. Mayor Emmerson told Mr. Drake that study would be given in committee.

The groups which met last week intend to have a meeting before January 31 for a progress report on their findings.
