

orgetown lawyer Ken Langdon. The attack against the Famfly Court is the latest in a series which have included blasts by grand juries and in the Ontario Legislature.

The county law association represents 80 lawyers in Halton. Langdon said the issue will go on the agenda for the next meeting and members will be asked to set out their dissatisfaction of the Family Court facilities for Attorney General Arthur Wishart.

Waiting Room

The waiting room of the Family Court is packed to overflowing and people are jammed into the corridors on the two court days a week, Langdon said. There is no place for clients to confer with their lawyer, he added.

The lawyer's father, Judge Kenneth M. Langdon, is the judge of the county Family and Juvenile court. Judge Langdon is also semior provincial judge in the county. Law Association president

Langdon said the case load at the Family Court is entirely too much for one judge to handle. "Therefore he must dispense
