

Hard up for Issues

P-C Boss Defends Crown Attorney

Opposition MPP's who complained about Halton Crown Attorney Douglas Latimer's connection with the Progressive Conservative party are "incompetent" who must be hard up for issues," said the Halton P-C Association president Wednesday.

John Kilmer was commenting on the criticism of the Georgetown CA by NDP and Liberal members in the Ontario Legislature, Monday.

They told Premier John Roberts to either fire Latimer or have him drummed out of the party. Morton Shulman (NDP High Park) said the Halton Tory association should be "a little less blatant about Latimer's connection with the party."

Latimer is a past president of the Halton P-C Association. His name still appears on the Association letterhead.

"What do they (the opposition) propose? That all Conservatives be unemployed?" commented Kilmer.

When Kilmer was asked if he had any intention of removing Latimer's name from the Association letterhead he replied, "None whatsoever."

Halton East MPP Jim Snow and Ken Langdon, president of the Halton County Law Association, also feel that the criticism of Latimer is unwarranted.

Langdon said making an "issue" out of such a thing is "garbage."

Snow said as soon as Latimer was named Crown Attorney he resigned from the PC Association because he (Latimer) felt it inappropriate to remain active in the party because of his new position.

"Since he was the former president of the PC Association before Kilmer, how could he be anything else but the past president," said Snow.

Snow said the Association has always carried the name of its executive on its letterhead and this includes the past president.

Langdon said complaining about the Crown Attorney's political leanings would be similar

to complaining about his church affiliation. "It makes no difference, and doesn't affect him in his work" he said.

Kilmer said NDPer Shulman had said earlier he was taking it on himself to watch over Halton.

"I guess Shulman felt he had not taken a pot shot at Halton recently and had to find something to complain about," Kilmer said.

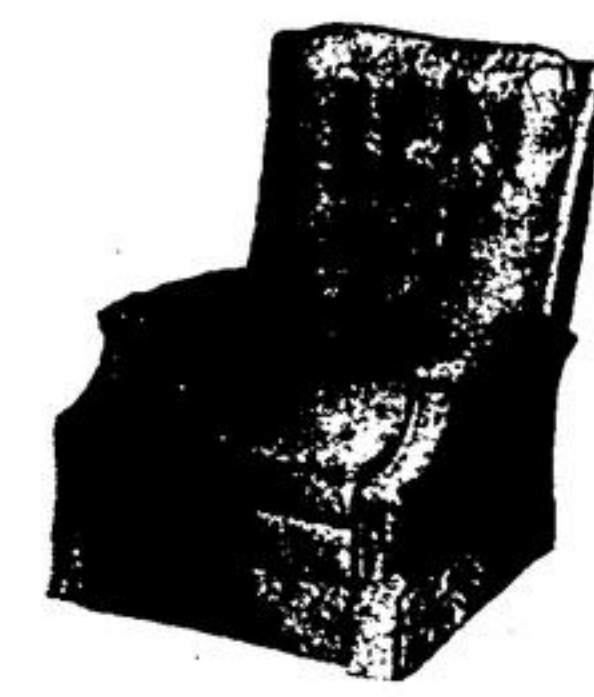

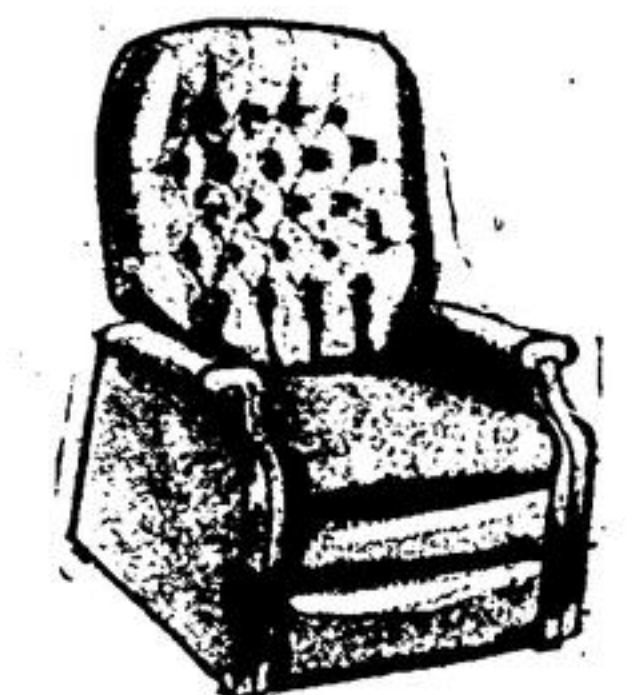
