### Rare Blood Available From Ottawa Storehouse

Most of us think of our Blood Group as O, A,B or AB and either Rh positive or negative and we know it is usuable up to 21 days after we donate it. We don't realize that there are over a dozen other grouping systems in that complex material that is our blood.

Blood, like everything else today, can be frozen and when stored at 80 degrees below zero centigrade, will keep for 2 or 3 years. But because it is a very costly and complicated procedure, it is impractical for everyday use. However, rare blood groups can be treated in this way and a National Bank of about 100 rare blood groups is stored in the Rare Blood Section of the National Defence Medical Centre in Ottawa. The list of rare donors in Canada is kept at the Red Cross National Laboratories in Toronto and is available for International use.


