

Work Starts Soon on Scotch Block Dam

After being held up for a month due to a government regulation, construction of the Scotch Block dam and reservoir is expected to begin soon.

Bot Construction of Oakville was the company which received the go-ahead to begin the work after submitting a bid of \$957,983.30, which includes bringing fill for the Esquing dam using scrapers across highway 25.

The problem was a government ban on using the earth-moving scrapers across Hwy. 25 unless a special permit was issued. This permit was not known about when Halton Region Conservation Authority officials let out the contract to be bid on.

REVISED BIDS

Once they found out about the regulation, bids had to be revised to include the cost of using trucks to cart fill and a new date had to be found to announced acceptance of a final bid, November 21st.

Total cost of the project will

be \$1,100,000 with 75 per cent of the funds coming from the provincial government and the rest of the money coming from local municipalities. All the land has been obtained by the Authority, says manager Dave Murray, but the final price on 3 pieces of land has not been finalized, he said.

CONTROL FLOW

Located on the east side of Highway 5 at the rear of Tangmere Mushroom Company, the dam will reduce runoff during heavy rainfall and will control the flow of the Sixteen Mile Creek during periods of low water.

The original estimate done in 1965 was to have the reservoir flood an area of 825 acres but this has risen to an area of 832 acres which gives the Conservation Authority a mile and a half long lake.

It is scheduled for completion in the fall of 1970 and Mr. Murray expects to have the dam full of water by the spring of 1971.

Ah, well, surely in 1970.

TAKE NOTICE THAT:

1. The Council of The Corporation of the Town of Georgetown intends to apply to the Ontario Municipal Board for approval to construct a storm sewer, 1850 feet long, having various diameters from 16" to 60" along Delrex Boulevard and through Block "F" in Registered Plan 720 in the Town of Georgetown, from Guelph St. to said Block "F". The estimated cost will be \$100,800 and the amount to be debentured will be \$70,000 payable out of the general rate over a period not exceeding twenty years.

2. Application will be made to the Ontario Municipal Board for an order to dispense with the assent of the electors to the undertaking of the said works. Any ratepayer may, within twenty-one days after the first publication of this notice, send by post prepaid to the Clerk of the Town of Georgetown at the address given below, a notice in writing stating his objections to such approval and the grounds of such objection.

3. The Ontario Municipal Board may order pursuant to the statute that the assent of the electors shall not be required and may approve of the said works, but before doing so, it may appoint a time and place for a public hearing when any objections will be considered.

In 1970 the Retirement Pension age will be reduced from 66 to 65. Disability Pensions payable for the first time

Disability Pensions for contributors to the Canada Pension Plan will become available in 1970 for those who have contributed for 5 years. Generally, a person is considered to be disabled if he has a physical or mental disability that is so severe and likely to continue so long that he cannot get steady work. Benefits will also be available for a disabled contributor's dependent children.

The Canada Pension Plan also may provide rehabilitation measures where practical. Eligibility for a pension will be based on an assessment of an applicant's medical condition. If you think you might be eligible for a Disability Pension contact your nearest Canada Pension Plan Office. The address is listed below.
