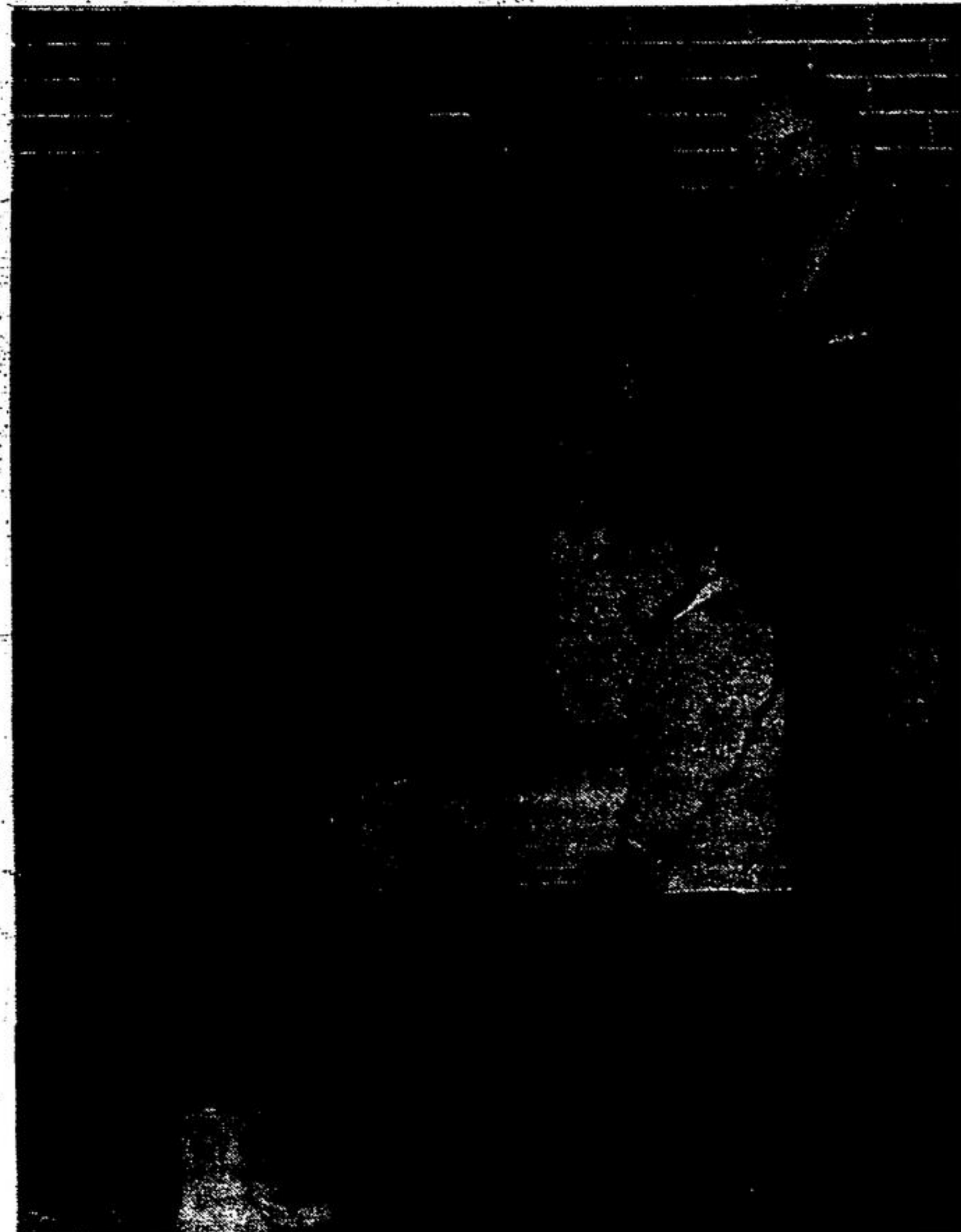


Four Lucky Sevens, Hope 'Y' Campaign to Reach \$10,000

A Bachelor of Commerce graduate of the University of Toronto in 1952, he joined the Abitibi Provincial Paper firm, where he had a summer job, and a year later came to the firm's Georgetown division as accountant.

Here he was a prominent member of Knox Presbyterian Church. He was church treasurer, a member of the board of managers and superintendent of the intermediate church school. As a member of North Halton Golf & Country club, he was an active golfer and curler, and continued his interest in these sports when he moved to Mitchell.

A Toronto native, he leaves his parents there, Mr. and Mrs. James Fenning; his wife Carol Anne Hicks; four children, Mark, Morah, Laurie and Andrew, and a brother Robert, North Burnaby, B. C.

Funeral service took place on Saturday in Knox Presbyterian Church, Mitchell, where the church pastor, Rev. Wallace Murray was assisted by Mr. Fenning's brother-in-law, Rev. Gordon Hendra, Kingston, in conducting the service.
