Regarding her pleasure of sharing a pleasant evening at the Wrigglesworth school, in celebrating the Georgetown Red Cross Society, established thirty years ago.

Their future programming is strongly planned for our very old, with their rich memories of the district, handicapped and

shut-ins. They are ready to possess news and knowledge of the elderly and assist them to move with the outside world, keep their minds mentally alert. Many are sorely in need of practical assistance. A kind heart goes a long way.

The Toronto Junior League took an extensive survey last winter, prepared a guidebook for persons with physical limitations, to enter churches, art buildings, hospitals, theatres, etc., also transportation available. Red Cross Society, 460 Jarvis Street.

In October we flew to England with the Halton County Multiple Sclerosis Society of Canada. The full plane was made up by the Oakville Engineers, thus enabling the MS group to raise research funds.

Calling at the nearby Red Cross building, we saw senior citizens being served tea, inside and out, among the fragrance of thousands of colourful roses.

Our visit was ameliorated with necessary needs for the benefit of our stay.

We were visiting with my brother, C.E. Forster, himself an R.A.F. prisoner of war during the last war. First two years they nearly all starved until a seaway was cleared by the navy to allow Red Cross parcels to enter Italy.

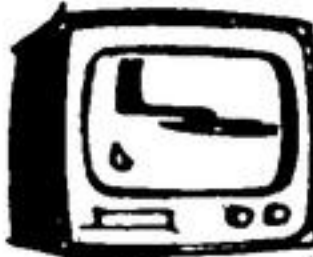
