Even A Train Couldn't Stop Tough 'Ol Barney

Yes, my father's dog Ol' Barney was hit by the flyer on the big iron bridge east of Georgetown. He lived another 4 years to howl about it.

It happened this way. The late Jack Tost (Schultz to many of his friends) and I were hunting an area called the point. We had shot a few bunnies ahead of Ol' Barney and decided to call it a day. However, Ol' Barney had other ideas. At this time he was heard going down river in hot pursuit of a bunny. At this time Jack and I heard a short train roar over the bridge. It was going west. We presumed it was the six o'clock passenger flyer. Both of us decided to leave Barney and go home as it was getting late.

USUALLY WAITING

Usually we would be waiting for it with Ol' Barney at our side. It never failed to send a shiver of excitement up and down our spine especially when it roared passed us and onto the bridge. We always appreciated the big wave of the hand the engineer gave us.

Much to our dismay Ol' Barney was seen coming down the far bank and heading for the bridge. We both crouched down so the dog would not see us, and hoping at the same time that he would sense danger and cross the river at the rapids where we sometimes did.

The engineer waved to us and pointed back as the flyer roared by.

ONE HOUR

We knew from experience that another train wasn't due for at least 1 hour and hoped that our hunter would follow us and be safe over the bridge before one hour was up.

We always when crossing this bridge walked between the edge beam and the outside rail track. Spacer blocks made of wood were inserted between the ties there.

Jack and I were in a jolly mood, because Ol' Barney had helped us have a good day's hunt.

Our mood changed quickly when the shrill blast of a fast train whistle blasted the air. As we looked behind us, the familiar contour of the flyer, boomed up on the horizon as it was coming past Norval.

STILL ALIVE

Our guns and game were left to be picked up later as we hurried back expecting to find Ol' Barney in pieces. Instead, we found him with his nose wedged between the ties along the edge where we always walked. He was hit bad but still alive. A stretcher was made from our coats. We then rushed him over to Mr. Jack Armstrong's residence and phoned for Dr. Learmont who was the animal doctor at that time.

Dr. Learmont gave Ol' Barney an injection, gave us some pills for him and drove us home.

The next day Ol' Barney was up and walking around.
