A quarter million dollar field study centre will be ready for occupation by students on the 175-acre parkland in Terra Cotta owned by the board by May 1, 1970.

The Peel County Board last week approved sketch plans for the building, to be erected on the Terra Cotta property purchased in 1968.

The students up to 120 each session, will eat, sleep and study in and around the complex which was described as "notel in style."

**Persons with D.D.T.**  
in their possession must not discard it with the regular garbage, and under no circumstances should D.D.T. be poured down drains or flushed down toilets.

has been arranged by the Municipality of The Town of Georgetown in co-operation with the Halton County Health Unit and the Ontario Department of Health.
