Opening lead - Ace of Hearts

Many bridge players are puzzled as to how to bid a hand with a six card suit and a four card suit. Assuming the hand is strong enough, it should be bid as Sout's bid above. The six card suit is mentioned twice and then the four card suit is

This bidding is only slightly different from showing a five card suit and a four card suit. In this case you would bid the five card suit, then the four card suit and then rebid the five card suit. All this assuming that you have a hand strong enough to do all this bidding. The defense wins two heart tricks and leads a third round of the suit. Declarer ruffs this cheart and cashes the diamond ace. Now he ruffs a diamond. At'this point, declarer must decide whether to continue in cross ruff or to draw trump. He should draw one round of trump only. At this point declarer does not now

the diamond situation. He should lead a spade to the ace, and ruff another diamond. When the diamonds split, declarer can lead another round of trump. He now pushes diamionds until the opponents trump. However, he still has one spade left. In all declarer loses two hearts and a trump.. That's very good on only 16 high card points.

It's a good thing that North didn't decide to double West's final bid of three hearts. . A careful defence can hold East to just five tricks but who could foresee that on such few high cards?
