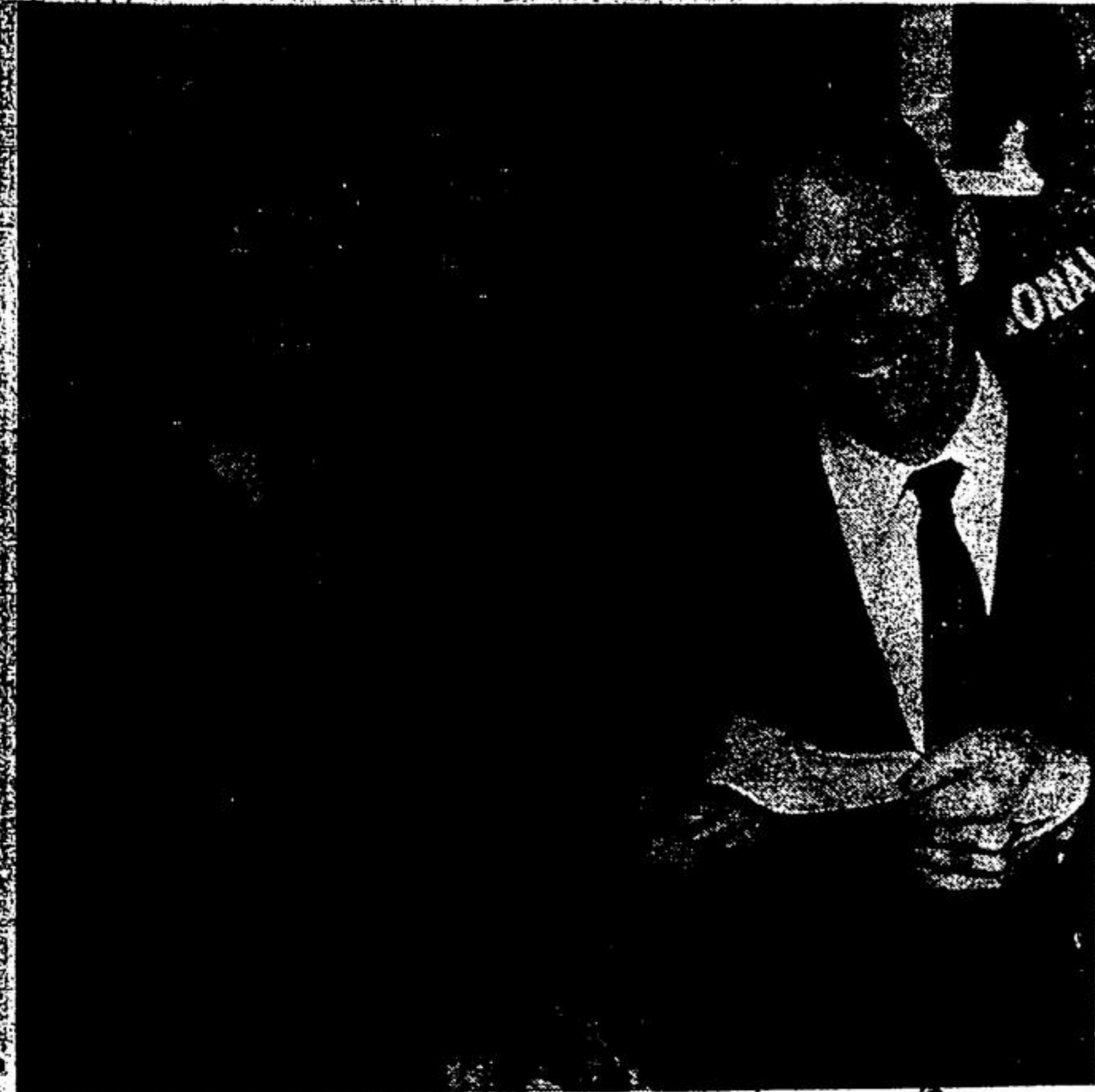


WINNINGS WORTH \$500

Here is a hand that came up recently. It contains an interesting point on bidding and one on play as well.

South dealt with neither side vulnerable.

The bidding:

SOUTH WEST NORTH EAST
1 D Pass Pass 1 H
2 D 2 H Pass Pass
2 S 3 H 3 S All Pass

Opening lead - Ace of Hearts

Many bridge players are puzzled as to how to bid a hand with a six card suit and a four card suit. Assuming the hand is strong enough, it should be bid as South's bid above. The six card suit is mentioned twice and then the four card suit is shown.

This bidding is only slightly different from showing a five card suit and a four card suit. In this case you would bid the five card suit, then rebid the five card suit. All this assuming that you have a hand strong enough to do all this bidding. The defense wins two heart tricks and leads a third round of the suit. Declarer ruffs this heart and cashes the diamond ace. Now he ruffs a diamond. At this point, declarer must decide whether to continue in a cross ruff or to draw some trump. He should draw one round of trump only. At this point declarer does not know the diamond situation.

He should lead a spade to the ace and ruff another diamond. When the diamonds split, declarer can lead another round of trump. He now pushes diamonds until the opponents trump. However, he still has one spade left. In all declarer loses two hearts and a trump. That's very good on only 16 high card points.

It's a good thing that North didn't decide to double West's final bid of three hearts. A careful defence can hold East to just five tricks but who could foresee that on such few high cards?

NOTICE OF 1970 INTERIM PROPERTY TAXES

TAX NOTICES are now being prepared for part payment of 1970 property taxes based on 50% of the 1969 tax rate as provided for in By-Law No. 69-41. Notices will be mailed to property owners by January 1st, 1970.

1st PAYMENT DUE JANUARY 15th, 1970
2nd PAYMENT DUE FEBRUARY 26th, 1970
3rd PAYMENT DUE APRIL 9th, 1970

Upon default of payment of the interim tax levy as set out, a penalty of one-half of one per cent of the amount in default shall be added on the first day of each and every month during which the default continues until December 31st, 1970, and thereafter interest at the rate of two-thirds of one per cent shall be payable for each month or fraction thereof of default after said date.

If you have not received your tax notice by January 6th, please contact the tax office as failure to receive a tax notice does not exempt you from paying penalty.

Petition Works, Village to Retain Its Natural Beauty

The old Forge appears doomed, but otherwise, Terra Cotta is safe... at least for the present.
Tentative plans to improve the winding road through the village were shelved by the good roads committee of Peel County council following receipt by the committee of a petition signed by more than 300 residents of Terra Cotta and visitors.
Residents feared that any attempt to straighten and widen the road would result in the loss of many landmarks and trees and destroy the beauty of the area.

NO PLAN
County engineer Bob Knight told the committee "The community as yet has no plan for a road through Terra Cotta. The only work being done is a survey to establish existing conditions as to road allowance. It is as proposed that the existing east-side bridge be replaced next year but that is all."
The county has already purchased one building and adjoining land in Terra Cotta the old Forge used until recently as a studio by sculptor Rebecca Sisler. Miss

Sisler sold the building, and the land to the county for \$25,000 and has since moved out.
LOCAL ROAD
In view of the objections to a plan that does not even exist," he said, "And the need for improvements elsewhere throughout the county, we would recommend that nothing be done on this road (through Terra Cotta). If the road cannot be improved to even minimum standards, it should be reverted to the local municipality (Chincouacou) and be maintained as a local road."
