### MOH Wants Water, Sewage Plan for Raceway Opinion

A letter from the Halton Medical Officer of Health, recommended to Esquering council Monday that they refuse to issue a building permit for the raceway control tower, until they see a plan for an overall system of water and sewage disposal.

In the letter Dr. I. A. Hunter said he had been informed there might be 200 people there one night through the week end and between 1,800 and 2,000 on weekends, with a top of 10,000 at major events. He stated further that all food and drinks would be dispensed from vending machines.

While admitting the soil was fine for septic beds, he felt it advisable that the control tower and office not be considered separately-but as a part of the whole complex.
