**Trucks Roll, But Neither Driver Hurt**

Neither driver was hurt when two trucks rolled in two separate accidents in Esqueving Township Thursday night.

In an accident investigated by Constable Joe Feldcamp, a truck driven by Douglas Pullen of R.R. 4, Orangeville received \$750 damage.

It left the road and rolled over on the 5th Line at about 6 p.m.

An hour and a half later a stake truck driven by Steve Keane of Milton flipped on its side on Highway 7 near the 4th Line of Esqueving corner doing \$600 damage to the vehicle. Constable Collison investigated this one.

The accidents happened during a heavy snowfall.

**Fire Damage at Main Street Home**

Georgetown firefighters responded to two alarms last week but didn't have to extinguish a flame.

Thursday, half hour before noon, a pan on an electric range at 41 Main St. S. caught fire. Mrs. John Stopper doused the flames before firemen arrived, but not before damage was done to kitchen cupboards, the ceiling and wall.

Firemen rigged up an exhaust to reduce the smoke damage and deodorized the premises.

Thursday, they were summoned to the R. B. Frost home on the Town Line near Norval when it appeared electrical trouble would start a fire.

**Drivers Escape Injury In Three Collisions**

A two car accident on John Street at College, north of the CNR subway did \$1,000 damage to cars operated by Hendrikus Van Alphen of Glen Williams and Barbara Reyce of 48 Ewing St., Thursday night.

It was the most expensive of three motor vehicle accidents investigated by Georgetown police during the week.

Police said the Reyce car was southbound on John Street and the Van Alphen car northbound when the latter slid into the path of the other car. The road was slippery.

The mishap occurred at 9 a.m. Property damage was estimated at \$500 to each car.

**OPPOSITE DIRECTION**

Peter Namik of 80 Ontario Street and Herbert Spitzer of 4 Ann Street were travelling in opposite directions when they collided on Ontario Street east of Main, Saturday.

The Spitzer car received \$500 damage, the Namik car \$200.

A rear end car accident Thursday afternoon resulted in \$150 damage to the back end of a car operated by Peter D. Booth of 27 Delrex Blvd. Police said he had stopped on Campbell Gate at Prince Charles Drive when collided with Shirley Somerville of 14 Baisrow Crescent. There was no damage to the Somerville car.

**Bag Missing Make Arrest**

A Georgetown doctor's medical bag was stolen from Georgetown & District Memorial Hospital, Sunday night. North Halton detachment of the Ontario Provincial Police said the bag was taken at about 9:40 p.m.

They made an arrest Sunday in connection with the case.

North Halton OPP handled the investigation because the Georgetown hospital is in Esqueving Township.

**Speed Suggestion Gets \$100. Cheque**

An R.R. 2, Georgetown employee of Canada Manpower's Brampton office has received an award and cheque for a suggestion she made to the department of immigration and manpower saving some of the taxpayers' money.

Mrs. Iris Routledge was awarded a cheque for \$100 and a certificate of merit for the suggestions.

Mrs. Routledge suggested that a form which is in constant use, be rearranged to prevent waste and save on printing costs. The suggestion could be implemented in Canada Manpower offices right across the country.

**Plan Conservation High School Course**

The geography - subject council for Halton Board of Education will be asked to draw up a course in environmental conservation for the high school curriculum in September, 1971.

The course as outlined by R. K. Self, superintendent of program, would include a study of the causes of pollution, what pollution is, its definition, long and short-term effects of pollution, cost to man of pollution, waste of natural resources, methods of control and cleaning up of conservation and its importance in maintaining supplies of man's raw materials, and moral obligation of citizens in fighting pollution.

**POLICE LAY 197 CHARGES IN MONTH**

Nine people were hurt in 28 automobile accidents on Georgetown streets in November according to the Georgetown Police Department's activity report for that month.

It shows 197 charges laid, 556 parking tags issued and 16 arrests.

A total of \$2,759 in fines was imposed.

There were five breakins, two thefts of over \$50 value, and 10 minor thefts.

There was also one car theft and one case of fraud.

In all the department investigated 286 complaints, and ran up 10,123 miles on their three cruisers and van.
