Reeve Alan Day of Oakville appears to be the top contender but there's a good indication his nomination will be contested by other members of the 14 man county council. Reeves and deputy reeves of Halton's zeven municipalities form the county body and two other reeves and two deputy reeves appear to be interested in holding the top chair this year.

Reeve elect Ron Harris of Milton, who has served on-the council for the past two years as deputy reeve, confirms he will likely be nominated at the inaugural meeting held early in January. If the "turn" system of rotating the top chair through the seven towns and townships is used, it will be Milton's turn in 1970 but reeve elect Harris said he was not actively compaigning for the




