Strong Raider Team Bows 4-2 to Huskies

Durham Huskies continued their domination of Georgetown Raiders in the Memorial Arena Sunday afternoon taking a 4-2 victory over the locals in an Intermediate B tilt.

Georgetown fell behind 3-0 before scoring the last goal of the first period, but never threatened to take control.

Each club scored once in the second period, and the third stanza went scoreless. Rahn was the Huskies' leader scoring twice and assisting on another. Neisen and Allen were the other Durham marks. Allen, Shafer and Aitken also had assists.

Miller from Jack Gudgeon struck for the first Raider goal at 6:27 and Gudgeon netted their second goal from Terry Lane and Phil Lavell at 7:06 of the middle period.

MATCH PENALTY

Just 8 penalties were called in the chippy affair, though there could have been more. Blake Inglis, who normally shuns the penalty bench, exploded in the first period when tagged for his second roughing penalty of the contest and drew a major and match sentences.

With less than two minutes left, Ron Lane and Campbell drew fighting majors for their scuffle.

The outcome was a surprise for Raiders who led one of their strongest lineups of the campaign in this one as they add muscle in preparation for Intermediate A company at playoff time.

ADD SENIORS

Among the 15 Raiders suited up was solid defenseman Bill Currie, making his first start with Georgetown this year.

In their shopping, the Raider management has picked off two former senior players, Don Currie from Oakville Oaks, and Reg Whaley from Galt Terriers both of whom will join the ranks shortly.
