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Town releases list of streets to be used as ravine accessways

The Town of Halton Hills has released its list of streets that it wants to use as accessways into the Hungry Hollow Ravine.

The Report on Hungry Hollow Accessways was presented to Halton Hills council at a recent meeting. The Town's Trails Advisory Committee has also endorsed the report, said member Wards 3 & 4 Regional Councillor Jane Fogal.

Decisions were made based on comments received at two public meetings last spring as well as comments from the Credit Valley Conservation and the environmental consultant who worked on the Hungry Hollow Management Plan.

Existing accessways will be maintained with additional signage at each entrance: Cedarvale Court, Terry Court, Dawson Crescent, Delrex Blvd. (3), Chelvin Dr., Maple Ave. and Mountainview Rd.

Future accessways will occur on Hall Rd., Miller Dr., Eaton St., and Main St. (2).

Other locations:

Flemingo Court: ancillary trail with signage at street

Heslop St.: ancillary trail with no signage at street

Lucinda Place: designate as local access (not shown on trail mapping); install post and rail entry fence, chain link fence on property lines, trail regulatory sign; remove chain link fence on ravine end of accessway; assume maintenance of accessway per Town standard for walkway blocks

Metcalf St.: ancillary trail with signage at street

Noble Court: designate as local access (not shown on trail mapping); open section of chain link fencing and provide trail linkage with trail regulatory signs as outlined in Hungry Hollow Management Plans (phase 2) when the main trail in Hungry Hollow is constructed; install interim signage advising of a future trail link at this location

Regan Crescent: designate as local access (not shown on trail mapping); remove wood fencing and reinstate access; install post and rail entry fence, property line planting where required, trail regulatory sign; assume maintenance of accessway per Town standard for walkway blocks

Sargent Rd.: designate as local access (not shown on trail mapping), remove wood and chain link fencing; install post and rail entry fence, chain link fence on property lines, trail regulatory sign; declare lands outside of six metre wide walkway block as surplus to Town's needs and sell per Town policy; dedicate revenues from land sale towards implementation of Hungry Hollow Management Plan; assume maintenance of accessway per Town standards for walkway blocks

Stockman Crescent: declare lands as surplus to Town's needs and sell per Town policy; dedicate revenues from land sale towards implementation of Hungry Hollow Management Plan.

Wilson Court: ancillary trail with no signage at street.

The report is available on the Town's website, www.haltonhills.ca. It will come back for final council approval sometime in October.

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NOTICE TO MONEY MART CUSTOMERS WHO MADE A FAST CASH ADVANCE OR PAYDAY LOAN IN ONTARIO IN THE PERIOD AUGUST 19, 1997 TO SEPTEMBER 9, 2007.

Read this notice carefully as it may affect your rights. This notice was approved by The Honourable Madam Justice Alexandra Hoy of the Ontario Superior Court of Justice.

THE CLASS ACTION
This notice is directed to all persons who received a Fast Cash Advance or a Payday Loan from a Money Mart store in Ontario in the period August 19, 1997 to September 9, 2007 and repaid it by cheque on the borrower's next scheduled payday.

The class action seeks, among other things, an order requiring Money Mart and its parent company, Dollar Financial Group, Inc., to refund all interest and other fees charged on certain Fast Cash Advances and Payday Loans in Ontario repaid by cheque on the borrower's next scheduled payday on the basis that such fees and interest breach s. 347 of the Criminal Code of Canada.

The defendants have brought a counterclaim in the action against class members who owe money to Money Mart with respect to any transaction and seek a judgment and/or set off against them.

THE CERTIFICATION ORDER
On January 5, 2007, Madam Justice Hoy certified the action Smith v. Ontario Money Mart Company, Court File No. 03-CV-1275, as a class action and appointed Margaret Smith and Ronald Adrien Oriet as representative plaintiffs of the class defined as:

All persons who, in the period August 19, 1997 to September 9, 2007, received a Fast Cash Advance and/or Payday Loan from Money Mart in Ontario that was repaid by cheque on the borrower's next scheduled payday.

If you are a member of the class, your rights will be affected. Each member of the class who does not opt out of the class action will be bound by the terms of any judgment or settlement in the class action, including any judgment or settlement with respect to the counterclaim. If the class action is successful, he or she may be entitled to share in the amount of any award or settlement recovered. However, a class member may not receive any money if the amount he or she is entitled to recover is less than the amount of money that he or she owes the defendants as a result of the counterclaim.

This notice is a summary of the terms of the certification order and the further April 20, 2007 court order. If there is any conflict between the provisions of this notice and the terms of those orders, those orders shall prevail.

LEGAL FEES AND DISBURSEMENTS
Counsel have entered into an agreement with the representative plaintiffs with respect to legal fees and disbursements. The agreement provides that counsel will not receive payment for their work unless the class action is successful or costs are received from the defendants. The agreement, which must be approved by the court to be effective, provides for a contingency fee of at least one-third of the amount recovered in the class action.

The plaintiffs have received financial support from the Class Proceedings Fund. As a result, if the class action is successful, the Class Proceedings Fund is entitled to 10% of any monetary award or settlement plus the amount of any financial support it paid to the plaintiffs.

Members of the class who do not wish to participate in the class action must opt out of the class action.
