Road employees receive increase
Road Department personnel in Esqueping township will receive a 28 cent an hour increase for the year 1970.
Grader operators will now make \$3.08 per hour, truck drivers \$2.88 per hour and laborers \$2.73 per hour.
Full time employees will have the benefit of 15 days per month accumulative sick leave and two days sick leave per month with doctor's certificate.
The township has also agreed to pay half the Health Insurance and half the Ontario Hospital Insurance for employees.
Each permanent employee will be issued one pair of work pants in April and one pair of overalls in October and will receive up to \$25 on a pair of safety shoes.
