Paul Daley's three goal, five assist performance was a big factor in the 8-4 Buffalo win.

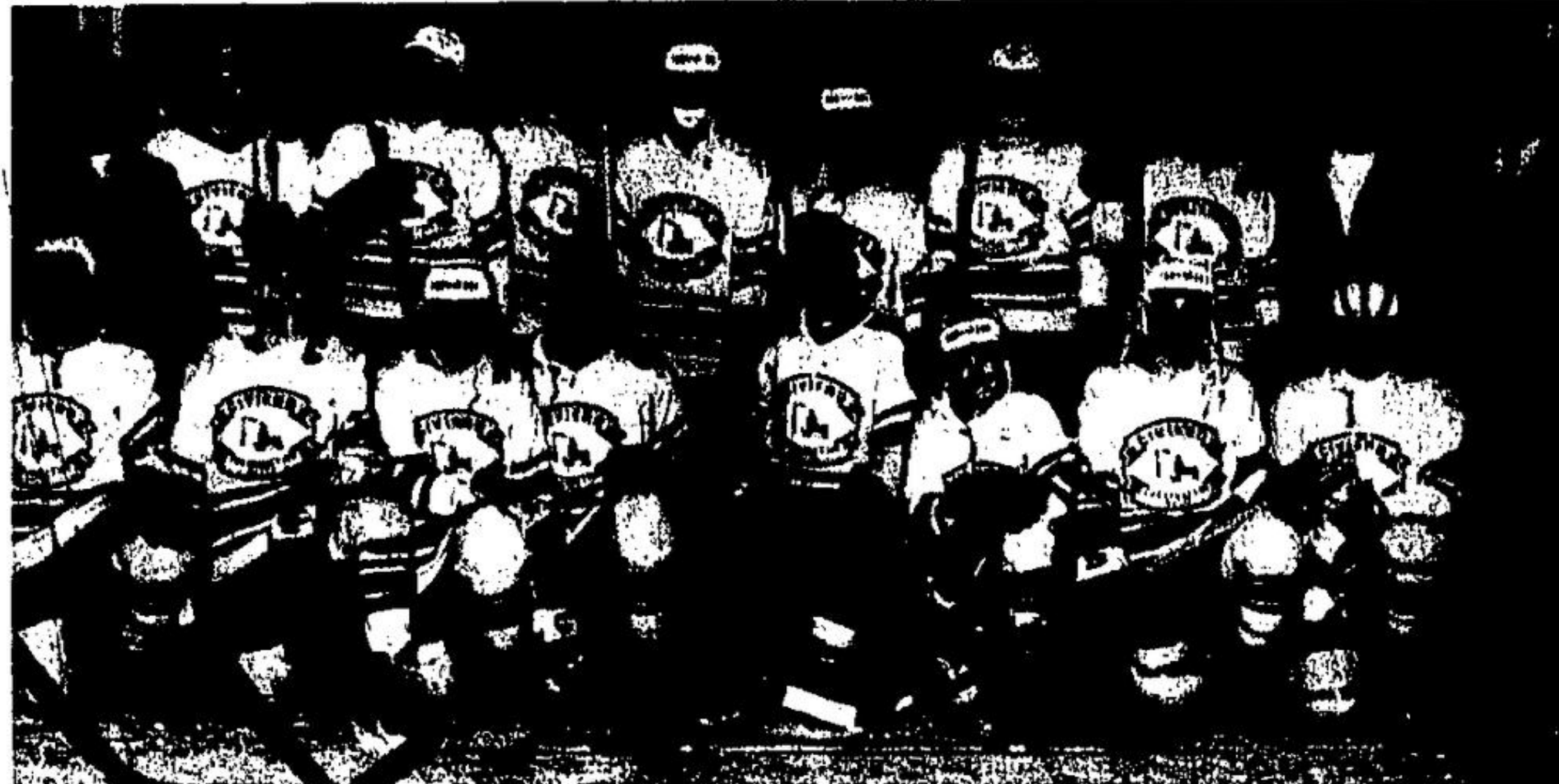
Charlie McCrea and Mike Ferguson also scored twice and Billy Cusher once. Ferguson added an assist.

**MIDGET**—St. Louis took a three points to one lead over Los Angeles, as a result of a 3-1 win. The first game of the series ended in a 3-3 tie.

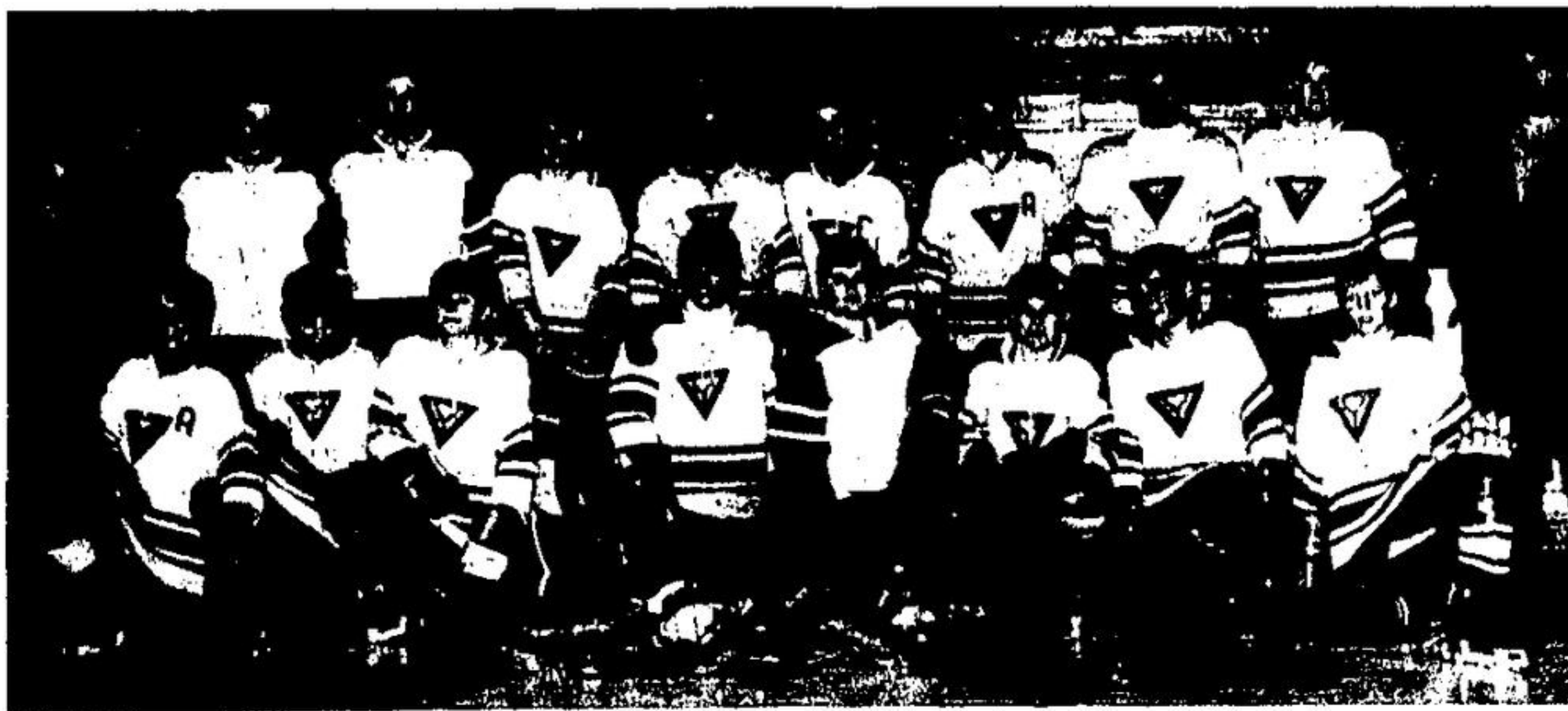
Randy Ferguson with two and Blair Slipp with one were the St. Louis marksmen. Slipp collected two assists and Steve Van Fleet picked up one.
