**May build Ashgrove drive-in**

A drive-in theatre may be built in Esqueving township, near Ashgrove. Theatre Holdings Corporation have purchased a 100 acre farm on the west half of Lot 11, Concession 7, and intend to develop the land for a drive-in theatre. The information was contained in a letter received by Esqueving Council at the regular meeting Monday night. An amendment to the township's agricultural holding by-law would have to be made to allow the theatre to be built. The by-law prevents the use of land for any other use than the one existing.
