Esqueving favors minor hockey grants to towns in north

Esqueving Council looked favorably on a request for assistance from the Milton Minor Hockey Association, following perusal of the association's budget for 1970-71 and a breakdown of figures showing the number of boys from outside Milton who play hockey in the minor system.

The Milton Association budget showed there could be a large deficit next year unless further grants were made available. Figures showed 59 boys from Esqueving played in Milton out of a total enrolment of approximately 500.

Deputy Reeve Tom Hill told council he would also like figures from Georgetown and Acton so "we could have them when we sit down for budget." "We should know what each town is spending for hockey and

find out what towns are spending for recreation," Councillor Marshall said. He suggested Milton could save some money on the budget by cutting the season. "It's so long it is almost boring," Mr. Marshall declared. He thought council should take into consideration the fact that Esqueving boys also play ball and other sports in Milton.

Clerk Del French used the discussion to remind council he hoped they would start to talk about the budget next week.

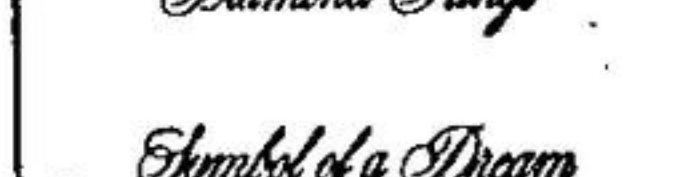
