TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Acton intends to apply to the Ontario Municipal Board pursuant to the provisions of Section 30 of the Planning Act for approval of By-law 70-1470 passed on the 10th day of March 1970. A copy of the by-law is furnished herewith. A note giving an explanation of the purpose and effect of the by-law and stating the lands affected thereby is also furnished herewith.

ANY PERSON INTERESTED MAY, within fourteen (14) days after the date of this notice, send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk of the Town of Acton notice of his objection to approval of the said by-law, together with a statement of the grounds of such objection.

ANY PERSON wishing to support the application for approval of the by-law may within fourteen (14) days after the date of this notice send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk of the Town of Acton notice of his support of approval of the said by-law together with a request for notice of any hearing that may be held giving also the name and address to which such notice should be given.

THE ONTARIO MUNICIPAL BOARD may approve of the said by-law but before doing so it may appoint a time and place when any objection to the by-law will be considered. EXPLANATORY NOTE

The general zoning by-law of the Town of Acton is being amended to restrict the height of apartment buildings to be constructed henceforth to a maximum of seventy (70') feet.

This amendment is necessary to clarify the ambiguity which currently exists and will relate only to property located in RM zones. (Residential zones fourth density).

THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF ACTON

By-law No. 70-1470

A By-law to amend By-law 1358 as amended by By-laws 1416 and 1462

The Council of the Corporation of the Town of Acton enacts as follows:

1. By-law Number 1358 as amended is hereby further amended by adding section 6.4.3.11 making the height for main buildings (maximum) seventy (70) feet.

2. No part of this By-law shall come into force without the approval of the Ontario Municipal Board, but, subject to such approval, this By-law shall take effect from the passing thereof.
