# Acton walkers help raise \$6000 in 32 mile walkathon Saturday

A group of five boys including Chris Schuts, John Hansen, Scott Somerville, Joey Schuts and Bernie Taylor was the first Acton contingent to complete Saturday's 32 mile walkathon, that raised close to \$6,000 for the Ontario Farm Home for Deaf Children near Milton.

The lads reached the community centre at 2.10 minutes ahead of the first girl Cindy Barr.

Over 160 Acton students started out at 7 in the morning along a route that took them south on Highway 25 to Milton, east along the Base Line Road to Hornby, north on Trafalgar Road to Silvercreek and west along Highway 7, back to Acton.

172 Walkers from Milton also took part. Their route took them east on the Base Line Road to Hornby, north on Trafalgar Road to Silvercreek, west on Highway 7 to Acton and south on Highway 25 to Milton.

All walkers were sponsored by families, friends and school chums.

Recording statistics at the Community centre were Debbie Jordan, Gib Jordan, Thelma Jordan, Dolores Jordan, Marie Shadbutt, Gail Farrell and Bonnie Gillespie.

Official walkathon cars, police, Acton Lions and St. John Ambulance patrolled the route to aid walkers.

Last year's walk raised \$5,500 to help send Canadian deaf athletes to the World Olympics for the Deaf in Belgrade, Yugoslavia.

- Authorized the purchase and installation from J. L. Wilson and Co. of a new pump and condenser for the arena's ice machine at a cost not to exceed \$6,000.
- Authorized secretary-treasurer Doris Townsley to pay the financial statement in the amount of \$1229.38.
- Arena manager Harold Townsley reported that barrels have been painted and will be placed in Fairy Lake, the first week of June.
- Authorized Harold Townsley to hire Mr. Reg Newton as park gate attendant for the summer.
