## Smith and Stone employees start return to work

By a vote showing 62% for and 38% against, members of Local 1421 U.A.W. ratified a three year contract with the management of the Smith and Stone plant Georgetown Monday night, and employees began returning to work today (Wednesday) after a strike that lasted close to 13 weeks.

The new contract calls for wage increases of 75 cents per hour over three years for skilled tradesmen and from 17 to 32% cents per hour for hourly production workers. Sickness and accident benefits have been raised \$10 per week across the board and health and welfare is

to be fully paid by the company.

In addition members will receive \$100 retroactive pay, when recalled to work and an escalated cost of living allowance, beginning June 1, 1971.

Workers are to be recalled according to departmental seniority. All employees are expected to be back to work within three weeks.
