Concerned that neighbors not notified of rezoning

Concern that those affected had been notified, was voiced by Nassagaweya Planning Board Wednesday when they noted an Ontario Municipal Board hearing on rezoning Cloverleaf Holdings at Campbellville for quarrying, was set for June 11.

The Council had sought a delay in the hearing pending legislation expected by the end

of the month from the province. Reeve A. MacArthur noted a postponement may be obtained but it will not be known until the OMB convenes in Brookville at 11 a.m. Thursday.

The site of the rezoning application from quarry holding to quarry is off the Guelph Line just north of highway 401.

The Board agreed to notify the Village Trustees of Campbellville as well as adjacent or nearby landowners. It was pointed out the requirement to notify those within 400 feet

might not be sufficient because of the extent of the area affected by quarrying.

The proximity to the race track and the Conservation Authority's Hilton Falls project was also noted.
