



### House on road will swap land

Esquesing council will send a recommendation to County Council to go along with Peel and Chinguacousy township in settling a road allowance which cuts right through the house of the Warren family on the town line between Esquesing and Chinquacousy.

Mrs. Warren-appeared before the township council Monday to ask that Esquesing go along with Chinguacousy and Peel allowing the family to trade 33 feet of road allowance from Peel for 33 feet they can buy from the Credit Valley Conservation Authority, which goes the depth of the lot.

Mrs. Warren said the county road committee would give them a Quit Claim deed if they sold 33 foot strip to the conservation authority.
