## Dredge makes all-stars

After close to two decades in the league, Campbellville shortstop Elmer Dredge is in the Halton County Senior League's all-star starting lineup. Dredge, who is hitting .352, is at .35 one of league's solid old pros. Dredge broke into the league as a teenager and has played just about every position, including pitcher and catcher, but the Freeton resident has really come into his own as a shortstop in the last three or four years. Last year he was named winner of the Morden Trophy as the league's most valuable player, but failed to make the first team. Last year was his fourth time on the second team. He lost out to Leaside shortstop Alf Payne.

Rated as the league's best defensive shortstop, Dredge regularly makes plays that Campbellville general manager Len Andrews insists, "I still don't believe."

Dredge is the only Campbellville player on the starting team, but catcher Doug Lang and pitcher Garney Mitchell are on the backup squad.
