Acton O.P.P. lose auxiliary policemen

Minutes of Acton council's public works committee disclosed that it will no longer be

possible for Elmer Roszell and Leo Reimer to continue as auxiliary police officers attached to the Acton detachment of the O.P.P.

The Police Act specifies that Auxiliary Policemen must be attached to a municipal police force, ruling out Constables Reimer and Roszell who have assisted Acton police on many occasions. They would be permitted to be affiliated if at any time Acton establishes a local police force.

Both Mr. Reimer and Mr. Roszell volunteered their services to police in Acton free of charge, assisting whenever requested.

Councillor Orv Chapman, chairman of the police committee, told The Free Press that the committee endeavored to find some way to reimburse both auxiliary policemen for their time but it was not legal under existing laws.

Inadequate insurance coverage made it hazardous for the auxiliary policemen to assist in routine police procedures especially where there was danger involved.
