Oppose Bell rate rise

Nassagaweya Council supported a joint motion by the Ontario Municipal Association and Association for Mayors and Reeves that would forbid any further increases in the rates for Bell Canada.

Bell's income according to the council's information would jump 12 per cent of \$17 million if the increase proposed goes through.

Bell's income has shown substantial rises ever since 1958, council said. The request for permission to raise rates will be heard in Ottawa.

County considers new department

The feasibility of establishing a county industrial development department will be studied by the county's Industrial Development Committee.

The matter has been under study by the Warden's special committee on industrial and economic development. The proposal would be to merge all existing industrial development programs of local municipalities at the county level.

Warden A. Day had suggested that because regional government has been temporarily delayed in the Halton-Peel area that a study should be made to see if an economic and industrial development department could be established at the county level.

Some advantages

In early discussion with representatives of the province, the committee chaired by Reeve Ron Harris, noted one of the advantages of such a department would be the larger population and tax structure to support economic development. From the provincial viewpoint, it was suggested, it would be simpler to have one person to contact in reference to the whole county. The provincial representatives emphasized it was often difficult to avoid parochial attitudes.

R. J. Cooksley, Director of the Industrial Development Department of Oakville studied the Economic Development Department in Renfrew County recently and reported to the Warden's special committee on his findings.

The plan is to approach the department idea in two stages with the first stage being a co-ordinating body at the county level. The main function at that time would be as an information centre. Guidelines for stage one are to be prepared and referred to the committee.
