Reeve A. MacArthur stressed the need for limits on the funds to be spent for director honorariums. He estimated it had amounted to about \$1,000 a month during preparations for the conference and the staging of the series of public meetings.

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CORDC considers folding but province praises work

Despite optimism and expressions of keen government interest by government representatives to the annual meeting of the Central Ontario Regional Development Council, executive members talked openly about the possibility of closing the doors of the operation.

The annual meeting of the Council, held at the Skyline Hotel, Toronto on Monday evening heard words from Dr. Richard S. Thoman, Director of the Regional Development Branch of the Department of Trade and In-

dustrial which were in sharp contrast to those from executive members.

Will have manager Dr. Thoman maintained the regional development program was moving ahead very effectively. He cited the role of CORDC in a critical area of Ontario and stressed the need for an active advisory organization in the area. "The Province is keenly interested in the welfare of CORDC", he suggested. He announced that Milton Phillips would be made available by the
