

Record 79 babies in three-hour show

A record of 79 babies were judged in a three hour marathon Saturday afternoon at the fair. There were 76 entries in the seven classes, totalling just one short of 80 bouncing babies parading before the judges.

There were just 62 babies last year.

Genial master of ceremonies Charlie Kirkness announced the classes and winners and presented the champion babies with Carter's baby wear from his company, Mason Knitting.

Nurses judge Mothers, grandmothers and two fathers brought the youngsters up to the panel to three judges, nurses Mrs. John

Cunningham, Mrs. Bob Laughlin and Mrs. Stewart Wolfe.
