Church services, W.M.S. plaque unveiling in news

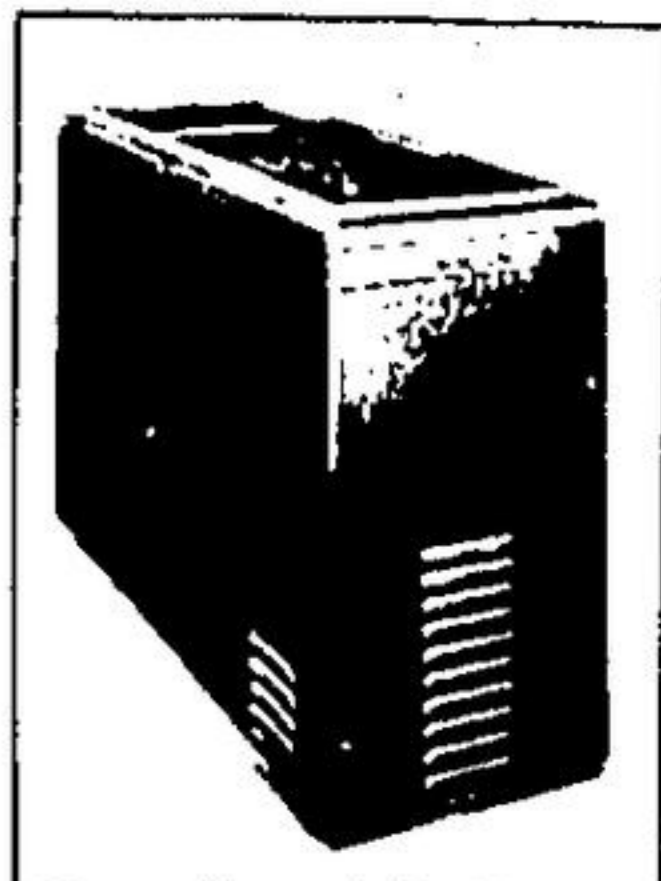
