Following questioning by Trustee Jim Price, committee chairman Keith Black of Acton District High School agreed there was a lack of pre-planning and lack of supervision on some trips, noting some were loosely organized. "This often happens in May or June," he said, noting that it put an unfortunate cloud over field trips and pointed out the need for restraint and supervision.
