# Sideroad widening angers residents feet and they prefer 100 feet.

Halton County Roads Department has become involved in unother controversial subject. Suggested repairs and widening to 15 Sideroad that passes through Esquesing Nassagaweya Townships has angered citizens.

Esquesing Deputy Reeve Tom Hill questioned roads committee chairman Gordon Gallagher on the proposed changes. Hill said he had heard it was to be widened to 100 feet in some places.

Mr. Gallagher explained there were no immediate plans to widen the road but explained the Department of Highways asks that no county roads be under 86

Esquesing Reeve George Currie told of a delegation that appeared at this week's township council meeting. He said there is a group of citizens passing a petition asking for a meeting with county authorities. He was quoted earlier as saying he would eat his shirt if the road was safe for traffic, and said he would eat the same shirt if he was proven

Nassagaweya Reeve Mrs. Anne MacArthur suggested it was the township's most scenic route and she didn't want it destroyed and used as a thoroughfare for the trucks.

"I don't want to see the trees butchered. They enjoy butchering. Listen to them sometime. They whistle while they work. They love it," she

"I'll stand by the people of Nassagaweya and if it means taking the road back as a township road to save the scenic beauty, we will," she callmed.

Acton Deputy Reeve Ted Tyler sald if the people in the area valued the life of their children they would welcome improvements to the road. He said school buses used that road and claimed the "road wasn't fit for snowshoeing with the dipsy doodlin curves."

Nassagaweya Deputy Reeve Gordon Agnew suggested work should be done to make the road safer and told how his son almost lost his life in a car crash on that road and a woman employee of his was involved in a car accident on that road.


# Ask for hearing
