The Proposed Amendment is Cited Below:

Amendment No. 6 to the Official Plan of the Acton Planning Area

1.) Purpose and Basis of the Amendment

Most of the area covered by this Amendment was annexed to the Town of Acton on October 1, 1968. The Town is of the opinion that this area should be included in the Official Plan of the Acton Planning Area. Abutting the annexed area is a small triangle of land presently designated as Conservation. This triangle of land is to be changed to Residential to coincide with the Residential designation to be applied to the recently annexed area.

2.) Map Change Description and Location

The parcel of land lying to the east of Mill Street extension and south of Cobblehill Road adjacent to the Fairview Cemetery is to be included in the Acton Official Plan by designating the area for residential purposes, and a small triangle of land presently designated as Conservation adjacent to the annexed area is to be also changed to Residential.

3.) Development Policy

The residential policy as contained in Section IVB (1) on page 8 of the Acton Official Plan, shall apply to this Amendment.

4.) Implementation

The detailed zoning classifications will be based on a development plan covering the whole area included in this amendment. The appropriate zoning classifications will be established as an amendment to By-law 1358. Any persons interested may within the prescribed time, file in writing their opposition to or support of the said amendment, to the Secretary-Treasurer of the Acton Planning Board, 40 Mill Street East, Acton. Final date for filing objections will be December 8th, 1970.
