Notice of Hearing**

Please take notice that the Ontario Municipal Board has appointed Monday the 28th day of December, 1970, at the hour of half past ten o'clock in the forenoon (local time) at the Council Chambers in the Town of Acton for the hearing of all parties interested in supporting or opposing the application by the Corporation of the Town of Acton for approval of its restricted area. By-law 70-1470 passed the 10th day of March, 1970. The approval of this By-law would restrict the height of apartment buildings to be constructed henceforth to a maximum of (70') seventy feet. This amendment is necessary to clear the ambiguity which currently exists, and will relate only to property located in RM zones.

This hearing is being primarily held to decide whether the above mentioned By-law should or should not be approved. Requests for change will only be considered by special leave granted by the Board and if sufficient notice has been given to the Clerk of the municipality to permit the notice of such requests to neighboring property owners. It should be noted also that any decision made at this hearing is subject to the right of any person interested to apply for an amendment under Section 30 (19) of The Planning Act.


