Management course given

Th University of Waterloo is starting another program in Supervision Management, beginning late in January. The last course was well-attended by industrial employees from this area with 39 graduating from Level 1 to Level II out of 43 students, according to the university.

The purpose of this program is to prepare the participant for responsibilities as a manager. It is directed to line supervisors and operating managers in business, industry and government, who are concerned with "improving" productivity and reducing costs of operation. These foremen, supervisors and department heads provide the channel of communication through which policy changes are directed to the

work force.

What is required at the first line management level today, is a combination of applied common sense, judgment and initiative based upon a developed managerial awareness of what really motivates people. The development of this awareness involves a practical working knowledge of the influence of social and economic change upon decision-making at the task performance level. A combination of case studies,

are used to encourage maximum participation in this programme. Upon successful completion of the three levels, a certificate in Supervision-Management Studies will be issued by the

Halton-Peel - Do you want to further your education at Sheridan College, but lack Grade

12 standing The Sheridan College Entrance Program (SCEP) is designed to prepare mature students who lack a formal Grade 12 education to enter full-time programs at Sheridan College.

. The 25-week program starts January 19 in Oakville and runs every Tuesday and Thursday from 7.15 to 9.45 and costs \$75. Sheridan College teachers will instruct the program, which is being presented through the Continuing Education Division and the Technology Division at

Sheridan. Ability Students will be evaluated on their progress during this period with emphasis on ability to do further studies in a college

environment. "Success of the program is measured in terms of the student's day to day participation

and also his ability to handle a full-time program," says Burrt Bonnell, assistant director of Sheridan's Continuing Education Division.

Successful completion of the program qualifies students to register in general and technology programs at the college.

25 done Last July, 25 students successfully completed an eightweek summer daytime SCEP program held in Brampton and many were recommended for registration in the college

program of their choice. "The Continuing Education Division stresses the importance of programs such as SCEP that allow a wide opportunity for adults to continue with their education in the Peel-Halton

area," Bonnell said. Other students are considered for admission to the college if they have completed Grade 12, with a 60 per cent average or are 19 years or older.
