This week, I'm just going to jot down one of the greatest helps I've had in the kitchen this holiday season, and make my Christmas present to the cooks in the area a valuable one, - Time. It's a recipe for a basic mix that can be whomped up into all sorts of goodies at short notice. I've used one variation or other on just about all my shopping days for the past month or so.

BASICMIX

In a large (and I do mean "large") bowl or small dishpan mix 5 lbs. flour, 21/4 cups powdered milk, % cup baking powder, 3 Tosp. salt, 2 Tosp. Cream of Tartar, 1/2 cup sugar. Sift. Cut in 2 lbs. shortening until it looks like cornmeal (and this takes some doing.) Store in large canisters at room temperature.

BISCUITS-Blend 4 cups mix, 1 cup water. Knead briefly, pat flat, cut and bake at 450 degrees for 10 minutes.

PANCAKES OR WAFFLES-Beat 1 egg and 114 cups water, Add 3 cups mix, beat till just slightly lumpy, cook as usual.

MUFFINS-Combine 1 egg and 1

cup water. Blend with 3 cups mix plus 2 Tosp. sugar. Bake at 450 degrees for 25 minutes. GINGERBREAD-Beat 1 egg, 1/2

cup water, 1/2 cup molasses. Mix 2 cups mix with 1/4 cup sugar, 1/2 tsp. cinnamon, 1/2 tsp. ginger, 1/2 tsp. cloves. Blend in liquids gradually. Bake in 9" square pan at 350 degrees for 40 minutes.

COOKIES-Beat 1 egg, 1/2 cup water, and I tsp. vanilla. Blend in 3 cups mix, 1 cup sugar, 1/2 cup nuts or chocolate chips. Drop by spoonfuls on greased cookie sheet. Bake at 375 degrees for 10 to 12 minutes.

COFFEE CAKE—Beat 1 egg and 2-3 cup water. Add 3 cups mix and 1/2 cup sugar. Blend well and pour into 9" square pan. Top with a McKenzie. mixture of 1/2 cup brown sugar, 3 Tosp. butter, 1/2 tsp. cinnamon, 1/2 cup nuts or raisins. Bake at 400 degrees for 25 minutes.

YELLOW CAKE—Blend 3 cups mix and 11/2 cups sugar. Beat 2 eggs, 1 cup water, 1 tsp. vanilla. Add half of liquid to mix and beat 2 minutes. Add rest of liquid and beat 2 more minutes. Pour into 2 prepared round pans and bake at 325 degrees for 25 minutes.

CHOCOLATE CAKE-Add 1/2 cup cocoa to dry mix before adding liquid.

NOTE: I shopped when things were on sale, and the flour and shortening only cost me \$1.00. This amount of mix makes one batch of everything listed, and 3 or 4 extra batches of biscuits.


