Jury decides pair guilty of hold-up
After almost three hours of
deliberation Wednesday, a jury
found Douglas McLeod, 34, of
NewLiskeard, and Ernest
Trudeau, 38, of Orangeville,
guilty of the armed holdup of the
Royal Bank, Hillsburgh, last
July.
They were remanded in
custody until February 3 by
Judge J. D. Sutherland for a pre-
sentence report. The judge told
the jury he could find no fault
with their verdict. He also
commended police and
particularly Corporal C. Judson
of the Guelph detachment of the
O.P.P. for their work with the
case.
Marked bills
Investigation into the case took
a turn when marked five dollar
bills taken from the Hillsburgh
bank began appearing in
circulation.
Eric Breadner, presently
serving a five year sentence for
his part in the hold-up, was the
first of three men to be arrested.
He led police to places where
money, guns, wigs and coveralls
used in the robbery, were hidden.
He also told police McLeod and
Trudeau were accomplices in the
robbery.
The pair will be sentenced
when court sits February 3.

Booth nets neat profit
