Committee completes report county roads needs study

The report of a roads needs study committee has been approved by the roads committee of county council and will be presented to the full council for their approval March 16, Esqueping Council was informed.

In order to implement the report it will be necessary for the county to assume responsibility for 18.8 additional miles of road in Esqueping and return responsibility for a total of 3.7 miles of road to the township. April 1 is the date it is hoped the new system can be established.

Roads which may revert to the township include: First Line and Three Alderod from Upper Base Line Road north and west to Esqueping-Nassagaweya boundary in Milton Heights; First Line from Five Alderod north to a point in Lot 9 opposite the quarry entrance; 15 Alderod deviation through Lot 16 Concession 7 from 15 Alderod north and east to the Seventh Line in Stewarttown.
