# Dead elms

Elm trees ravaged by "Dutch. Elm" disease, an eyesore along 401 Highway, are being felled by work gangs recruited from Manpower and Welfare Agencies

Some of the men enjoy the outdoor work and are glad to be working, but others admit they would rather be on welfare. Reason? They receive less money working than they get on welfare.

One worker has said the provincial government, which organized the bee under the supervision of the engineering department of the Department of Highways to combat unemployment, should make up the difference between his welfare cheque and the one he receives for working.
