## Museum critic raps spending

Georgetown's outspoken Reeve Rick Morrow launched one of a series of attacks against what he called extravagant expenses of the Halton County Museum at County Council's March meeting last week.

He urged that the museum give up their charter and be put under the control of the county as other county functions are. He claimed that if the charter was relinquished the county would have more control on the operation through the year.

Charges extravagance He noted advertising and the annual Christmas parties as examples of extravagance. When Nassagaweya Reeve Anne MacArthur claimed she and other members had paid most of the expense for the party by giving up per diems, Morrow retorted, "The per diems didn't even pay for the booze." He claimed the per diems would only account for about \$130 of the total cost of \$387. He said with other parties during the year the entertainment bill would be over \$1,000.
